Monica Guerra is an Executive Director and the Head of US Policy for Morgan Stanley Wealth Management. In this capacity, she provides strategic public policy and market guidance for financial advisors and clients. Before coming to Morgan Stanley, Monica worked as a municipal bond analyst in Fitch Ratings' U.S. Public Finance group. She also dedicated nearly a decade of her career to public service, holding positions such as a Director of Capital Budget and Economic Development for the City of New York, Legislative Aide in the U.S. House of Representatives, and as a political campaign operative. Since joining the firm in 1997, Mr. Caplan has been involved in over \$100 billion of real estate acquisitions and initiatives in the United States, Europe and Asia. These include major acquisitions such as Equity Office Properties, Hilton Hotels, Logicor and GE Real Estate.

Before joining Blackstone, he was at Lazard Freres & Co. in the real estate investment banking group. Mr. Caplan received an AB in Economics from Harvard College, where he graduated magna cum laude, was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and was a John Harvard Scholar. Mr. Baijal joined Invesco when the firm combined with OppenheimerFunds in 2019, having joined OppenheimerFunds in 2011. Prior to joining the firm, Mr. Baijal co-founded Six Seasons Global Asset Management, where he served as partner and portfolio manager with a focus on fixed income macro strategies. Before his role at Six Seasons, he was a partner and portfolio manager at Aravali Partners, LLC., where he focused on absolute return and interest rate hedging strategies. Previously, Mr. Baijal was a partner and portfolio manager at Havell Capital Management, LLC., where he focused on fixed income macro and relative value strategies.

Earlier in his career, he was a senior portfolio manager for international, global, and multisector fixed income portfolios at Neuberger Berman. Mr. Baijal has also held positions at Banca Di Roma, The First Boston Corporation, and Merrill Lynch and Co.

Mr. Baijal earned a BA degree from the University of Delhi and an MBA from Columbia University. He currently serves on the Foreign Exchange Committee at the NY Federal Reserve, an industry group providing leadership to the global foreign exchange market. In addition, he is a frequent speaker at sell-side conferences and client events of current and anticipated macro conditions in both developed and emerging markets.
